>> The only thing you must to do is to save the profiles somewhere. If you
>> go to AD and check the user properties you will see a Terminal Services
>> Profile Path. Set that somewhere like
>> \\YOUR_FILE_SERVER\TSProfiles\%username% where TSProfiles is the share
>> name and YOUR_FILE_SERVER is a file server you may have.
>> There is no need for Session Directory.
>> For Load Balancing if you are using Windows 2003 TS you can use NLB,
>> although NLB is not resource based (this means if a server gets stuck on
>> 100% CPU, NLB will still send users to that server). If you are looking
>> for an easy to use resource based load balancing solution take a look at
>> WTSGateway Pro.
