As soon as it reboots, bang, the System portion of the eventlog is corrupt. I've tried starting the system with the eventlog service disabled, and then clearing it from there, but to no avail.

>> Just thought I'd let you guys know of this problem I had today and how I  
>> solved it.

>> After installing SP1 and rebooting, my server was unreachable through my  
>> network. Logging in locally showed that the RDP listener was up and  
>> listening (through tsadmin.exe), although port 3389 was not listed when a  
>> netstat was run. I wound up deleting the RDP-tcp listener through terminal  
>> services configuration and then recreating it. After a reboot, things came  
>> up fine. As far as remote desktop does, I can now successfully connect to  
>> the system. Not sure why this all happened though.

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>> On the other hand, the System eventlog appears to be corrupting itself  
>> whenever a reboot occurs. That's a different story which I haven't solved  
>> yet.
