This Server is running Windows 2003 Server with SP1 with all critical updates. The firewall is not enabled (first thing I checked). When I run firewall.cpl, it asks if I want to enable it.

The message I get from the client end is just the regular can't connect message:

Remote Desktop Disconnected

The client could not connect to the remote computer

Remote connections might not be enabled or the computer might be too busy to accept new connections.

It is possible that network problems are preventing your connection.

Please try connection again later. If the problem continues to occur, contact your administrator.

I had tried installing "terminal Services" – multiuser at one point and I think that is when I saw these error messages in the Event Log:
