> following the update seems pretty conclusive to me. Unfortunately,
> I
> already installed the update so telling me "do not use it" is just
> about as unhelpful as you can be.

> > Obviously, the update did more than just add the one registry key.
> It IS dangerous and you should stop misleading people.

> > > If you have a problem, use System Restore.
> > > Or uninstall the update from Add/Remove Programs, look for
> "Microsoft
> > > Data Access Components KB870669"
> > > It is not with the other updates.
> > >
> > > And I am not in denial to suggest such is ridiculous because of
> the
> > > fact my computers work after the patch..
> > > This is a pretty simple update.
> > > It is likely there was already something wrong with System
Restore
> > > before the patch was installed.
> > > To know with a degree of certainty a patch caused a particular
> issue,
> > > SR would need to be successfully used immediately before the
patch
> and
> > > attempted immediately after the patch.
> > > Even in those circumstances is not conclusive proof, Windows is
no
> > > where near that simple.
> > > Any other timing leaves wide open potential causes.
> > > There are a great many things that can cause issues with System
> > > Restore.

> > > If you think it is flawed, do not use it, make the changes to
the
> > > registry manually or skip it all together.
