> *1. sc sdshow wuau serv*

> *2. The following output should be displayed.*

> CSWLOCRRRC;;;AU)(A;;CCLCSWRPWPDTLOCRRC;;;PU)

> *3.If the security descriptor for the wuau serv service is different then
> below instructions will set the correct permission for the service.*

> *Set the Security Descriptor*

> *1. Click Start.*

> *2. Choose Run.*

> *3. In the Run box, type cmd.*

> *4. Click OK.*

> *5. At the command prompt type sc sdset wuau serv*
