>>why you are not offered any updates.

> I suspect it is not working like it should as I noticed this Windows
> Update.log was not updating like it normally does, every day or so. I
> knew SP2 was available to download but it (Automatic Updates) did not
> alert me to the fact; consequently, I did it manually.

> I guess I'll find out for sure when other downloads are available?

>

> Would it be worth deleting those two logs in the hope they are both
> re-created?

You can safely delete %windir%\WindowsUpdate.log, it will be recreated when something is to be logged again.

Also, please take a look in the file

%windir%\SoftwareDistribution\ReportingEvents.log for a history listing (note that the text goes pretty far out to the right).

(%windir% is typically C:\Windows)

Do you have any activity in that log file?
