I have tried the secedit /configure etc. that was given; it worked perfect but now I get an error that the domain controller not found. So I had to restore my system to yesterday, then I tried the secedit ... again and same error. What else can I do. (NOTE: It did allow me to download the program KB892130 and updates but I couldn't fix the domain controller problem) so I resotred it again. Help How can I try the /areas REGKEYS SERVICES. What goes on the command line?

Hi,

As you got into some trouble, I would have started out with just resetting the registry permissions first (the most common reason for the 0x80070005 error).

Just add "/areas REGKEYS" (without the quotes) to the previous secedit command line, like this (note that command line will wrap over two lines in this post, you need to unwrap it):

```
secedit /configure /cfg %windir%\repair\secsetup.inf /db secsetup.sdb  
/verbose /areas REGKEYS
```

After running the command above, see if the update installs without the 0x80070005 error, and that you don't have the domain controller problem.

If the result is that you still get the 0x80070005 error, run the secedit command line one more time, replacing the text REGKEYS with SERVICES
