I have used this on the machines that are getting the error and it seems to have fixed the error.

USE REGEDIT AND GO TO THE FOLLOWING KEY
HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\MICROSOFT\WINDOWS\CURRENTVERSION\EXPLORER.
with the explorer key highlighted, create another key (a subkey) by clicking Edit, New, and Key. Type AlwaysUnloadDLL to name the key, press ENTER double-click its default value, type 1 in the value field, and click OK. Close REGEDIT then reboot the computer.

XP should now empty the DLLs from the cache memory

Well, I tried this, but it didn't help me.

Also, I researched it and according to the MSDN web pages, this setting was no longer used after NT 4.0 and earlier, so it would seem that you just happened to have a coincidence that your errors went away after you did that and rebooted.
