I have intentionally not installed this driver due to the addition of a third-party graphics card. Prior to installing the new card, the advice given was to uninstall the graphics driver from the original controller and disable the original controller which I have done.

A few moments ago, windows automatic updates appeared saying Windows has found one update and, not being able to identify the update as well as

being

under the impression it may be a security update, I clicked ok to install.

At the last minute, I saw it was the Intel driver I'd previously installed.

By then it was too late and on restarting, the driver was once again installed. Intel advises not to use the driver if the system has a third-party graphics card installed.

That's not all, 1) Originally after the installation, the Intel controller was listed first under display adaptor in Device Manager then NVidia graphics card. 2) Yesterday, I noticed NVidia was listed first with (Microsoft Corporation) next to it then the Intel controller was listed.

few moments ago, I noticed it's reversed to the original Menu listing.

I did have an issue earlier with Nvidia card and had to uninstall/reinstall drivers but that shouldn't keep things playing hop scotch.
