What is required to run Windows Vista Upgrade Advisor?

To install and run the Windows Vista Upgrade Advisor, you will need:

- \* Administrator privileges
  - \* .NET 2.0\*
- <snip>

If no application nor program that is installed requires .NET Framework 2 in order for it to run, than you can uninstall it from Add/Remove Programs in the Control Panel.  
IF .NET Framework 3 is installed than do \*NOT\* uninstall 2.

Is there an ATI display adapter and the Catalyst Control Center installed ? If yes, close Catalyst Control Center in normal Windows mode and see if the folders can be deleted. If Quicken/QuickBooks or other accounting software is installed and that's what installed .NET Framework 2.0, suggest stopping it/them from loading on boot temporarily and see if that helps in deleting the folders.

Have you done a boot to Safe Mode and then attempted to delete the folders ?
