>> As a work-around for now, I'd suggest that you first implement your own

> set

>> of tuning APIs, making those work first. Next, I'd package that up into

>> your own ActiveX control which maps to the same CLSID and functionality

>> of

>> MSVidCtl.

>> While not ideal, it would unblock you and let you have a common model

> across

>> both XP and CE.

>> Note: The next version of Windows CE will **not** have the MSVidCtl support

>> that you're looking for. However, you should work with your CE

> distributor

>> to communicate this feature-request.
