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OK, if you've got a driver, presumably it came with a list of registry entries that you have to make for it, right? Just simply **having** the DLL laying around isn't of any use whatsoever. You could also build a DEBUG version of the OS and capture the debug messages to see if the driver is being loaded and, if it is, why it's failing.

When you say that you "can't find the correct driver", what do you mean by that? It's a Prism2-based card? If so, you'd set BSP_NIC_ISLP2NDS in the build environment and sysgen. This will result in the file islp2nds.dll being included in the OS. When you plug in your card, the system will probably pop up a dialog saying that it doesn't know what driver to load. You'd enter "islp2nds.dll" in that dialog and everything should work.
