> > > *located in an unavailable location, protected with a password, or the*

> > > *The folder is available (it's where we got the original file from), the*
> > > *files are NOT protected by password, and apart from the root directory*
> > > *structure, there are no '/' or '\' in the filename (which is usually simply*
> > > *adding a numeric value to the previous filename.*

> > > *As stated in the subject line, we've had no problems over the past 15 years,*
> > > *but just this week, 2 computers only (out of about 9 or 10) have exhibited*
> > > *this exact problem.*

> > > *My computer has Windows 2000 Pro and my assistant has Win XP Pro. We both*
> > > *run Office 2002 (XP??).*
