What you are seeing is to be expected.
Settings in a heading

style

will

not be reflected in the corresponding TOC
entry. And when you

modify

a

TOC style the formatting will apply to the
whole paragraph.

It is possible to get the result you are asking
for by using

direct

formatting: Remove the underlining from the
heading style and

reapply it

as direct formatting (for example, by
selecting the text and

pressing

Ctrl+U); then update the TOC.

Note, however, that you may find it easier to
just live with the
appearance that you have now, that is, either
having the entire

entry underlined or having no underlining at all.
