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Hi Koko,

Do it like this:

```
Dim time1 As Date, time2 As Date, interval As Long
time1 = Format(Now, "HH:mm:ss")
MsgBox "Wait a while."
time2 = Format(Now, "HH:mm:ss")
interval = DateDiff("s", time1, time2)
MsgBox "The MessageBox was displayed from " & time1 & " until " & time2 & ".
an elapsed time of " & interval & " seconds."
```
