Hi Jeff,

For Windows Vista the 'Ease of Access Center' has separated the size of cursor and cursor blink rate into separate dialogs. The setting for 'None' for cursor blink rate is under 'Make the Keyboard Easier to use=>Keyboard Settings.

In the 'Keyboard properties' dialog on the 'Speed' tab it's the lower left slider position.

You may want to also check the Vista Accessibility tutorials at <http://microsoft.com/enable> for other settings for the display that may be helpful to you.

I'm using Windows Vista and couldn't readily locate a choice of "none" for the blinking rate; however, in Word "draft" view, as you indicated, the cursor stops blinking and remains visible when moving due to holding down the spacebar.
